# Nippon love

Boro and Shibori are two of the most commonly known Japanese textile techniques. Both working mostly in Indigo hues, they are very popular in the traditional school of Japan simply because they are fabulous. If Boro means to stitch together different patches of worn fabrics, Shibori is a totally different technique using the tie dye procedure where cotton or linen pieces are folded and dipped several times in indigo vats.

This story-like realm keeps one of the most beautiful European textile heritages: the tartans. Originated in woven wool, tartans are associated often with Scotland, those famous kilts of the Scottish men always made of tartan patterns. In the past, the Highland tartans were associated with regions or districts of Scotland, rather than clans. Being produce by local weavers, each design was influenced by local tastes and made with natural dyes available in that area.

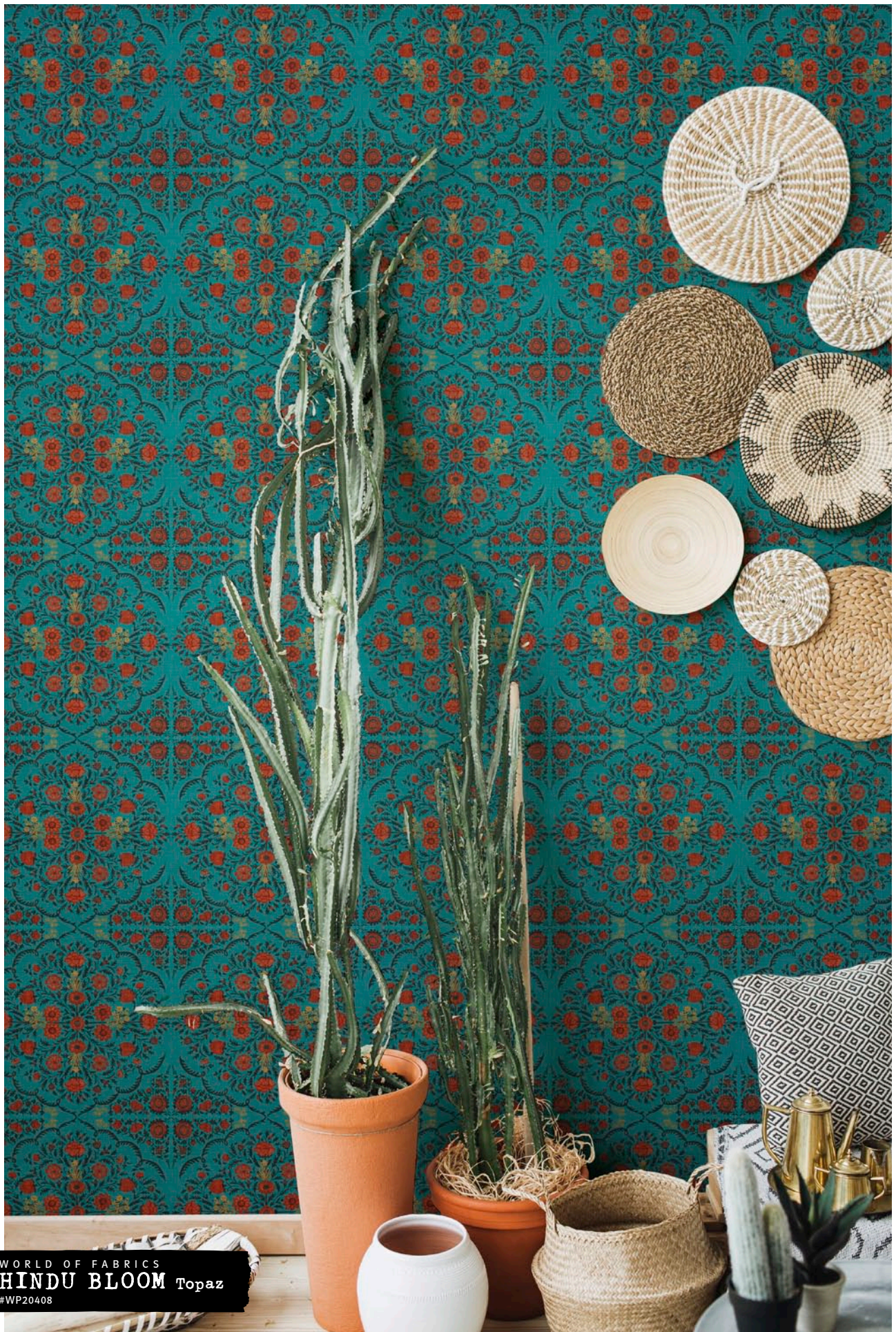
